

WONDER speaks to the natural curiosity children have about their world. They appreciate the natural world and observe beauty in what they see, hear and do in their surroundings.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT involves the enhancement of large muscles such as those used in running, jumping and climbing, and small muscles such as those used in drawing and doing up buttons.

INTELLECTUAL DEVELOPMENT relates to the emerging powers of knowing and reasoning. Children develop the ability to communicate their understanding through language and emerging literacy.

SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

connects to how young children feel about themselves, how they behave and how they relate to people close to them, such as caregivers, teachers, and peers.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR PREKINDERGARTEN?

The Saskatchewan Ministry of Education's prekindergarten program is for three- and four-year-old children. If your child will be three years old by January 31, they can start prekindergarten in September.

Please note that priority will be given to children who are three years old by the end of August.

WHERE SHOULD I REGISTER MY CHILD FOR PREKINDERGARTEN?

Prekindergarten students can register at any school of their choice. However, most students register at the school that serves the neighbourhood where they live (also known as their catchment area).

HOW DO I REGISTER MY CHILD FOR PREKINDERGARTEN?

Students interested in prekindergarten must apply before registering as spaces are limited.

To apply for a prekindergarten program, please contact the school where the program is offered.

WHAT ARE THE LANGUAGE OPTIONS FOR PREKINDERGARTEN?

English is the language of instruction in most programs; however, there is a Cree language and culture program at wahkohtowin school and a Michif early learning program at Westmount school. There are no French Immersion prekindergarten programs.

WHAT IS THE SCHEDULE OF PREKINDERGARTEN?

The hours of prekindergarten are based on the bell schedule at each individual school. Prekindergarten students attend their program on a half-day basis (AM or PM), Monday-Thursday each week.
