#### 3. Roles in the Safety Plan

- Salvation Army Site Manager Safety of people/ awareness of facility and land
- Project Leader Safety of people/ communications/ follow-up
- Teacher students and parents attendance, communication with school administration
- Parents student safety
- Students listen and stay together
- Secretaries communication, liaison
- Principal/ Coordinator –-communication, guidance, follow-up
- Superintendent communication, guidance, follow-up, come on site
- SPS Facilities come on site, assist with follow-up/ clean up

<u>Support Team</u>: a group of adults identified to assist with clean-up, follow-up and support after the crisis. These will include many of the people above, neighbours, Salvation Army members, teams of teachers, or Urban Camp. Tasks might include site clean-up and support after a crisis.

#### **Teacher responsibilities:**

- Students must be supervised at Brightwater at all times day and night
- Teachers should have an emergency phone list readily available should a crisis arise. This list should include student names and contact phone numbers for each class.
- If students are sent home or picked up by parents or another adult, a record must be kept by the teacher as to where the child went and with whom.
- Students must adhere to all school rules camp is an extension of school where students are active engaged learners
- Walkie-talkies are available for teachers, supervisors and facilitators. Check that device is well charged and on same channels = Channel #2.
- Students remain with instructional groups during sessions and in designated areas during choice time - Students are not permitted to 'wander off'
- An adult supervisor should accompany each facilitated instructional session
- One adult at camp must be certified in Standard First Aid and CPR
- The School First Aid kit will be available in Somers Hall
- There will be an emergency vehicle on site at all times
- All medicines will be kept with the adult in charge and will be administered according to parent's instructions (have provision of medication form filled out for each child requiring medication)
- Parents must sign Out-of-School Education form and Medical form
- Teachers Complete Out-of-School Education form for administration
- Copy of program itinerary provided to school administrator and Brightwater project leader
- Project Leader will provide a copy of the Schedule of Camps to Corman Park Police, teachers, central office administrator and Salvation Army Site Managers

#### 4. Safety Plans

**First Aid kits** are available in the Brightwater office on the SA site and in the School House on the SPS site. Teachers are responsible for providing a school first aid kid and an adult certified in First Aid when visiting Brightwater.

#### Fire Alarm Call 911

You are at Brightwater Centre/ Beaver Creek Salvation Army Camp. Land Location SE ¼ section 6 Township 35 Range 5 (See attached map)

Notify adults via walkie talkies Channel #2, Siren (in safety kit) or on-site bell

Notify Site Manager and Project Leader

Notify SPS personnel by phone (see phone list)

<u>Fire in a building</u> - Evacuate and meet at picnic tables by Somers Hall or flag pole (if fire is in Somers Hall). Teacher takes attendance.

<u>Fire on land</u> Meet at picnic tables. Teacher takes attendance. If a student or parent is unaccounted for, the teacher must report absence to Project Leader and Site Manager. Group evacuates site - call Hertz bus and drive to home school.

<u>Evacuation</u> - Sound Bell/Siren and meet at picnic tables in front of Somers Hall. Teacher takes attendance of students, parents, facilitators. Arrange for buses for pick-up. Notify administration. Meet at home school.

General Lock-Down - No buildings can be locked from the interior.

Take shelter in cabins. Stay away from windows. Turn out lights. If in Somers Hall, take shelter in back kitchen area away from large main hall. Plan for evacuation and notify administration and EMS.

<u>Perimeter Lock-Down</u> - Notify all adults by walkie talkie if possible and in person. Take shelter in cabins. Stay in communication by walkie talkie.

**Bomb Threat** - Evacuate the site.

<u>Shelter in Place</u> - Move students to inside room or hallway if windows are not very airtight. Close all windows. Shut down any ventilation, heating, air conditioning systems (turn any room thermostats up in summer and down in winter). Remain inside in Shelter in Place until informed otherwise. Head to higher ground if gas spill. Notify administration.


<u>Weather Threat</u> - When a Weather Threat (tornado/ hail) is eminent: Move students into permanent hallways away from windows in cabins. Close doors in cabins. Use walkie talkies for communication if possible. Have students seated on the floor, hands on head if danger eminent. Remain in this location until notified by administration. If in Somers Hall, move to halls near kitchen, away from large hall.

<u>Utility Failure</u> - Meet in Somers Hall and an evacuation of site back to school will be arranged if utility cannot be fixed. No students are to be sent home unless contact with parents has been established. Spare phone in Brightwater office can be hooked up during a power failure. FLASHLIGHTS Locations: Somers Hall kitchen, Brightwater office, Nurses office (Melfort Hall), Workshop.

<u>Media</u> - All communication about any crisis is to be made by Joy Adams Bauer 683-8325. Staff should direct any media inquiries to Joy.

<u>Parental Communication</u> - Communication with parents will be made as soon as possible. This may take the form of a newsletter and/or media announcement. The secretary and admin team of the school will be responsible for the communication process.

To access the Saskatoon Public School Division land, turn left at West Hamlet of Beaver Creek Road off Hwy 219. Continue to chain link fence on your right and, "Brightwater Science and Environment Centre" wood sign. Park at gate or designated area near school house.
