INFORMATION FOR UPGRADING STUDENTS

- Register by Sept 30 in order to take up to two classes at no charge per school year as an upgrader in Saskatoon Public Schools
- Must be registered and attending at least one class by September 30
- Second class can be taken in September or later in the school year
- If registering after September 30, cost of tuition is \$500.00
- Payment can be made using School Cash Online by credit card or e-cheque

TUITION REFUND POLICY

- If student withdraws within the first two weeks-full refund
- If student withdraws between the third week and midway through the course-50% refund
- If student withdraws after the midway point of the course-no refund

WITHDRAWING FROM "NO-CHARGE" CLASSES

- If a student withdraws prior to September 30, they will not be eligible for courses at no-charge during the school year
- If the student withdraws between September 30 and the midway point of the course, they may take a different class at no cost
- If a student withdraws from a class after the midway point of the course, the course shall count as one of their two allowed courses at no-charge

Students may write a ministry-prepared supplemental examination to raise their marks in a Grade 12 subject for which a provincial examination is prepared.

- Rather than upgrading full classes, students may write any number of provincial examinations as supplementals at any of the sessions
- When a student has multiple course attempts, only the highest mark attained will appear on the Transcript of Secondary Level Achievement
