Supplemental learning plan reviewed by trustees during virtual meeting

The Saskatoon Board of Education held its first-ever virtual board meeting April 6 due to requirements that limit the size of public gatherings during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Trustees received an update on the division's supplemental education plan, which was developed in response to the pandemic and the indefinite closure of schools. A full copy of the plan is available for reading <u>HERE</u>.

The plan guides the work of teachers as they support student learning at home and keep students connected to school. Teachers will be available to students during the school day and will provide an appropriate amount of work to help prepare students for their return to school.

Student learning in the home requires support from parents and caregivers, which may be challenging. Teachers will be accessible to provide regular guidance and support and will work to ensure students and families do not feel overburdened.
