Literacy kits connect students, families and teachers in learning

Take-home literacy and numeracy kits created by primary teachers at Queen Elizabeth School are helping teachers, students and families engage in learning together.

The purpose of the kits, which were highlighted during the Celebrating Excellence portion of the Nov. 23 Board of Education meeting, was to provide math and literacy activities that promote literacy and numeracy in the home while extending the learning for the students. It's one way the school worked to respond to the engagement goal of the Saskatoon Public Schools' strategic plan.

The resource was well received by families and the value of the kits increased in the wake of the pandemic. Last spring, teachers enhanced their individual literacy and numeracy kits so each child had access to grade specific materials. These kits allow supplemental literacy and math to continue in the case of a temporary class closure and are particularly important when access to technology or wi-fi is not available.

In addition to its regular meeting, the Board of Education held its inaugural meeting Nov. 16. New trustees joining the board following the recent civic and school board elections are Michael Pidwerbeski in Ward 1, Kim Stranden in Ward 4, and Angela Arneson in Ward 10.

Incumbent trustee Vernon Linklater was re-elected in Ward 2, as were Kathleen Brannen in Ward 6, Suzanne Zwarych in Ward 8, and Charmaine Bellamy in Ward 9. Incumbent trustees Colleen MacPherson in Ward 5, Donna Banks in Ward 3 and Ross Tait in Ward 7 retained their seats by acclamation. MacPherson was chosen for a second one-year term as board chair during the inaugural meeting.
