Student engagement efforts highlighted for Board of Education

Learning that helps students build character through respect, responsibility, and perseverance was highlighted for trustees during the Board of Education meeting held March 15.

Saskatoon Public Schools strives to create experiences that inspire all students to reach their potential by providing engaging learning environments and fostering skills and habits that contribute to students' success in school and as citizens. A report from administration reviewed the division's work in areas such as citizenship education, student engagement and achievement, and the commitment to building life-long learners through authentic learning opportunities.

Assessment data gathered by teachers shows 75 per cent of kindergarten to Grade 8 students regularly show age-appropriate levels of responsibility and perseverance in their work. A further 20 per cent of students are sometimes demonstrating those skills.

At the collegiate level, results of the division's OurSCHOOL survey shows Grade 9-12 students feel intellectually engaged and are interested and motivated in school at levels higher than the provincial comparison.

Character and engagement have a big impact on students' current and future success. The correlation between fostering student engagement, developing character, and academic success are well documented, and the division is committed to achieving character and engagement goals.

The Celebrating Excellence portion of the meeting saw two student athletes and a coach from Bedford Road Collegiate, along with a representative of the Saskatoon Secondary Schools Athletic Directorate (SSSAD), talk about how the return of athletics for the 2021-22 school year has boosted student well-being, character, and engagement in schools. Due to COVID-19, SSSAD was unable to coordinate intercollegiate and elementary sport during 2020-2021.

SASKATOON PUBLIC SCHOOLS ABOUT YOUR SCHOOL BOARD

Q: How is education funding distributed in Saskatchewan?

A: Operating dollars for all school divisions are allocated using the provincial government's funding formula. Operating expenses (e.g. instruction, supports for learning, transportation) are calculated for each division. Larger school divisions are assumed to have built-in efficiencies so receive less per student funding.

The formula is complex and flawed. Funding for intensive-needs students is not determined using actual school-based data. Money is distributed based on community data and the assumption intensiveneeds students are equally distributed across the province. The result is Saskatoon Public Schools spends about \$11 million more on supports for learning than it receives in funding.

Trustees continue to advocate for changes to the model that better reflect the realities of Saskatoon Public Schools.
