- **North Park Wilson’s Creative Action class** – Creative Action is a specialized, full-year program for Grade 8 students who have shown leadership potential and a desire to cultivate their passion in the arts to make a difference in their community. Creative Action was recognized for their support of Adelle House, who offer second stage housing for women and children who have experienced domestic violence.
