APPLICATION PACKAGE



Housed at North Park Wilson School, Creative Action is a specialized, full-year program for Grade 8 students who have a desire to cultivate their passion in the arts and make a difference in their community. Students will collaborate with a variety of artists and organizations while working through Grade 8 curriculum in a creative and experiential classroom. Students will hone their skills in one or more strands of the arts (music, dance, drama, visual art), develop an artistic voice, and expand their toolkit as social justice advocates and empowered community members.



Creative Action Application Requirements

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

The application process is meant to challenge you to reflect on what draws you to the program. Please allow yourself time to thoughtfully and thoroughly complete your application. Only complete applications, with all required sections, are considered eligible.

There are four parts to this application:

- 1. Student Self Reflection
- 2. Arts and Leadership Experience Survey
- 3. <u>Artistic Self-Expression</u> (ex. Digital copy of a visual artwork, Audio Recording of a musical composition or performance, Video Recording of dance performance or monologue)*

This portion should be emailed to <u>CreativeAction@spsd.sk.ca</u> or submitted on a USB flash drive. Ensure that the student name and contact information is included in your email.

4. Referral Form

This form can be completed by a teacher, private instructor, or community member.

This person should have known the applicant for at least 2 years, and can confidently reflect on the applicant's strengths and weaknesses. The reference should not be a family member of the applicant.

ASSOCIATED COSTS

The cost to the student for this program will be a \$100 student fee. Payment will be due when the student begins the program. Acceptance into this program is not based on the ability to pay. If cost is a barrier, we can address the issue if the application is successful. There may also be additional fundraising that will require student time only.

SUBMITTING YOUR APPLICATION

Make sure that that you have completed the above checklist, including Student Self-Assessment, Arts and Leadership Experience Survey, Artistic Self-Expression and Referral Form. The first two items must be submitted (by mail or in person) to the office at **North Park Wilson School by April 29, 2022 at 4:00pm**. The Artistic Representation should be emailed or submitted on a USB flash drive. The Referral Form should be mailed to the school by the Reference.

Incomplete and late applications will not be considered.

The selection will be completed mid-May. All eligible applicants will be placed in a random lottery. A maximum of 28 students will be randomly selected. After selection, students will be notified of their status by email sent out during the first week of June. The waitlist will be a continuation of the random lottery and communication will only occur if a space becomes available. PLEASE NOTE: All communication regarding application and admission will occur via email. Ensure that the email address on your registration form is checked frequently. This is the email address marked "first parent/guardian" on the registration form.
