

TIMELINE OF GRADUATION ACTIVITIES

- Friday, June 13: Last day for grade 12 regular classes. Final Assessments begin on Monday, June 16. *See detailed schedule on page 2.*
- Monday, June 23: Graduation Exercises at 2:00 p.m. at Merlis Belsher, 2010 College Drive. **No tickets required to attend ceremony. No assigned seating (first come, first served)**

Last day of school for grade 12 students is Thursday, June 19TH. This is to ensure that all marks are calculated and submitted prior to the ceremony to ensure graduation requirements are met. All students, however, may attend the Grad Banquet and Dance regardless of graduation status. *Please email wmcgrad2025@gmail.com if you have any questions regarding the Grad Banquet and Dance.*

1. **Graduation Ceremony (In-Person Celebration)** - We will be hosting our Graduation Ceremony at Merlis Belsher Place (2010 College Drive) on Monday, June 23, 2025, beginning at 2:00 p.m. We ask that all graduates come at 1:00 p.m. in their grad cap and gowns to line up for a 2:00 p.m. start time. There are no tickets required for this ceremony and graduates can have as many guests as they like in attendance. Seating is first come first served and parking is free. The ceremony will be approximately 2 hours and 30 minutes.

2. **Graduation Gown Distribution** – We will be distributing gowns, stoles, caps, and tassels for students to keep. These will be distributed during the second week of June. We will let students know when they are able to pick them up. <u>Students are required to bring their cap and gown to Merlis Belsher Place on June 23th</u>. Details for gown pick up will be posted on the WMC Class of 2025 Edsby page.

3. **Diploma and Documents** - All graduates will receive a graduation folder with their certificate of graduation, formal letters of congratulations, and other documents during the graduation ceremony. If a student is unable to attend the ceremony, they can come to the front office during office hours and pick up their folder. The office is open during the summer: Monday through Thursday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., and Friday 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. Please call ahead to ensure someone is available to help you (306) 683-7850.

4. **Graduation Fees** – All school fees need to be paid prior to graduation. These fees include the graduation fee that is used to pay for the cost of the cap and gown, graduation folder, and rental cost for the ceremony. Contact the Main Office regarding paying fees. *Please pay these fees by Thursday, June 19th.*

5. **Edsby Grad Group** - It is crucial that all graduating grade 12 students be connected to the Edsby Grad Group; *WMC Class of '25.* This is where all graduation and post-secondary information will be posted. Parents of WMC grade 12 graduates are also welcome to join the group. If not already done so, please contact Student Services for an invite.





ATTENTION GRADUATES

• Between gown fittings and yearbook signings, a quick reminder: graduating students lose access to their accounts after the school year ends.

• Students should export their files as soon as possible. Accounts are removed after *MySchoolSask* does its rollover or when the student is withdrawn.

• Exact timing varies, but once they're gone, they're gone.

Google data, such as *Drive* or *Classroom*, can be exported by *Google* <u>*Takeout*</u>.

For <u>OneDrive</u>, students can select their files or folders and click "Download" to save them.
